Join educators during this follow-up session to the introductory professional development workshop on *Learning Ocean Science through Ocean Exploration*, a curriculum developed by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Office of Ocean Exploration and Research (OER). Conduct inquiry- and standards-based activities tied directly to ocean expeditions with Ocean Exploration Lead Instructor, Melissa Ryan. In addition, participants will have the opportunity to hear from and interact with Dr. Charles Fisher, Professor of Biology at The Pennsylvania State University. Dr. Fisher will present on the role of exploration in advancing our understanding of the deep sea, focusing on new discoveries of tubeworm biology, ecology and life history.

Pre-registration is required and space is limited. Each participant will receive unique take-home materials, a NOAA Ocean Exploration Certificate of Participation, a continental breakfast, and lunch. A \$100 stipend will be available for those who participate in both the Introductory and Follow-up full-day workshops.
